Reading is Fundamental to School Success

If you think about it, almost our entire system is based on our system's ability to understand, interpret and analyze written texts.

Our kids need to be capable, confident readers in order to make sense of the huge amount of information they're exposed to. Even if the information they're reading is on the internet, they still need strong reading skills to be able to understand and analyze it. They also need to be able to create written work that gets a particular message across in a coherent way and this requires the ability to read well. Reading immerses kids in language, exposing them to new words and to ideas and experiences outside their own day-to-day lives. Reading is about interpreting what the author has written, making meaning from what is said and from what is left unsaid and the more a child reads the better he gets at doing this. In a nutshell, reading is the foundation stone of all education.
