It's a term that's been around for a long time. Basically it is a process to look, listen and document in order to understand students' thinking. We are trying to "see" students' learning processes in order to support and deepen their learning experiences.

At Aubrey, numerous teachers at the school are trying to integrate different technologies to capture students' learning process. This

may include video, photography, blogs and students' portfolios. We are using our professional development days this year, as well as some time during of staff meetings to focus on this theme. Some of us are also attending a district professional development series with B.C. educator and researcher Sharon Jeroski called Communicating Student Learning, that explores this idea.

## School Snacks and Lunches

A healthy snack and healthy lunch are very important for students of all ages.

Please ensure to pack easy to open containers and all utensils needed for your child's snack or lunch. *There are <u>no utensils</u> available to provide to students*.

If you are delivering lunch for your child, please leave it at the office and we will call the child to pick it up at the beginning of lunch.

#### **Wet Weather**

Mud and slick grounds seem to be the norm around most schools at this time of year, due to fall rain and leaves. Please help your child be prepared for the elements by ensuring your

children have warm, water resistant coats and hoods or hats to keep dry. You may consider keeping a change of clothes at school for your child. A slip and fall at this time of year adds up to one very wet student! Thank you in advance for your help in planning ahead for the weather.

## **Medical Alert Conditions**

We seek to provide a level of supervision and care that will secure the safety and wellbeing of students with medical issues. A Medical Alert Condition is one which is diagnosed by a physician, and is a potentially life threatening condition such as Diabetes, Epilepsy, Anaphylaxis (history of severe allergic response which requires planned support), severe Asthma, or other conditions which may require emergency care and/or the administration of medication as determined in consultation with parents/physicians and the school. Accurate medical information is of extreme importance. Please inform the school of any of the above conditions.

## **Nut Aware School**

Several Aubrey students & staff have severe anaphylactic reactions to peanuts, nuts and their byproducts. Please join us in committing to doing everything possible to protect these students by refraining from sending foods to school that contain peanuts, nuts and/or their by-products if there is an anaphylactic student in your child(ren)'s classroom; reminding your child(ren) to wash their hands carefully after eating; and not using these products in any treats you may send into the classroom over the year. Thank you for your continued understanding and cooperation as we endeavor to make our school a safe environment for all!

## **Calendar Information**

Please check out the Aubrey Calendar on the school website for upcoming events, holiday dates, etc. Please check at least once a week, as we will be updating the calendar regularly as teachers book field trips and other special events.

## **Upcoming Newsletters and Listserve**

Communication is of utmost importance, and we work hard to keep families up to date with relevant information. District information, newsletters, and updates will sometimes be emailed out to families via our listserve system. There is a Consent to Send Commercial Electronic messages Form included in the student package requesting your current email address and authorization to receive emails from the Burnaby School District. Relevant information will also be posted on our school website, and families are asked to check the website periodically, as electronic communication can be unreliable, school emails can end up in Junk Folders, and so on.
